POINT IN TIME

- Annual Snapshot
- Includes all programs/people regardless of CMIS participation (DV, SMB, etc)
- Undercount of unsheltered
- Trends over time
- Basic Demographics
- Only people who are "Category 1" homeless per HUD's definition

CMIS/HMIS

- "Real-time" data about people who are
 "Category 1" homeless per HUD's definition
- Centralized Intake data about "need"
- System & Program Performance Outcomes
- Limited to CMIS Participating Agencies
 - Excludes:
 - State Service Center motel voucher holders that are NOT served at the Hope Center
 - Sunday Breakfast
 - Domestic Violence programs/shelters
 - Unsheltered data is limited













RACE & ETHNICITY Individuals who Identified with Racial Category

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








CI Referrals Made by Project Type Race and Ethnicity of Head of

- Homelessness has been going up since 2019 in DE.
- Many more people are in temporary and unstable living situations and at risk of homelessness than we "count" as homeless, or than receive homeless assistance from the "system" of homeless services
- Most impacted groups:
 - People with disabilities
- Black people/families
- 1 in 4 is a senior
- 1 in 4 is a child under 18
